

Biographical Information for Michael May

Michael May is former Co-Director of the Center for International Security And Cooperation and Emeritus Professor (Research), Management Science & Engineering at Stanford University. He is the former Director of the Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory (1965-71). He served in a variety of positions at the Livermore Laboratory for 34 years, until his retirement in late 1988 when he became Director Emeritus. He also served as US Delegate to the Strategic Arms Limitations Talks with the Soviet Union (1974-76), Technical Adviser to the Threshold Test Ban Treaty negotiations (1974), and in a variety of advisory positions to the US Government. He is a past Trustee of the Rand Corporation, a member of the Council on Foreign Relations, and a Fellow of the American Physical Society and of the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

May's current research interests are:

1. Nuclear weapons policy and the relationships among major powers.
2. The growth of energy consumption in East Asia and its environmental and security consequences.
3. The evolution of information technologies world-wide and its impact on international security.
