

Biographical Information for Alexander A. Rimsky-Korsakov

Dr. Alexander A. Rimsky-Korsakov graduated from the Polytechnical University in 1959. His field of speciality by education is Experimental Nuclear Physics. He began his professional career at V.G. Khlopin Radium Institute in Leningrad, USSR (now St.Petersburg, Russia). He served first as Junior Research Scientist (until 1966).

In 1966, he completed his as Ph.D. with a thesis on “Photoelectron Angular Distributions.” He conducted research in applied nuclear physics and non-destructive analysis, the nuclear fuel cycle, environmental analysis and monitoring, computer modeling of contamination in the environment.

Dr. Rimsky-Korsakov was promoted to Senior Research Scientist in 1967. He was promoted to Laboratory Head in 1977. He presented a Doctor of Science Thesis in 1985 and was awarded the full doctor degree in 1985. The topic of his research was “Nuclear Industry.”

In 1987, he was promoted to Deputy Director General for Science. He conducted research in various aspects of nuclear fuel cycle, HLW processing, handling and disposal

In 1996, he was promoted to Director General of V.G. Khlopin Radium Institute and continues in this capacity through the present date.

He has completed 216 publications and (unpublished) reports. He is the Chair of two Scientific Councils in the Khlopin Institute, a Member of the MINATOM Scientific Council, of the Ministry of Science Scientific Council on Nuclear Physics, and is a member of the Academy of Sciences Scientific Council on Nuclear Physics.
